Ichnusa Classic and Ichnusa Speciale are brewed in Assemini, a town near the capital city of Cagliari.

Founded in 1912, the beer was named after the ancient Latin name of Sardinia.

Birra Ichnusa has become a symbol of Sardinia and is loved worldwide.

Nose

It is a true triumph of harmony: a balanced flavour, color and a discreet aroma, a pleasantly bitter note which gives it the right character accompanied with persistent froth.

Palate

Moderately crisp and refreshing, tight and fine grain, with a light pleasant scent of hops.

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The quality of a mineral water will depend on the site of its source and the nature of the aquifer, the porous rock through which the water trickles. - BROCKEN SPECTRE ‘Gin For Tonic’** *Tasmania, Australia* 18
Gin for Tonic was the brainchild of an avid gin lover, frustrated with the way tonic over powers the delicate flavours of the spirit. The goal was to create a beautiful and elegant gin that stood its ground to become perfectly balanced and that's how Broken Spectre Gin For Tonic was born.
We recommend serving on ice with any Fever Tree tonic or martin.
- BROCKEN SPECTRE ‘Summer Gin’** *Tasmania, Australia* 20
The Tasmanian Summer Gin is infused with locally grown saffron post distillation, giving the liquid and golden hue and allowing the full rich flavor of the spice to create a distinct powerful spirit.
We recommend serving on ice with Fever Tree Light Tonic, Martini.
- FOUR PILLARS ‘Bloody Shiraz Gin’** *Yarra Valley, Vic* 18
Aromatically it shows fresh pine needles, citrus and spice with distinct peppery, dense raspberry notes. The palate is lovely and sweet with long juniper character on the finish.
We recommend serving on the rocks.
- HARTSHORN ‘Sheep Whey Gin’** *Tasmania, Australia* 21
This distillery is a new Tasmanian micro distillery making boutique batches of gin from their own sheep whey. They are the first in the world to create this unique product. Hartshon use only Australian native botanicals (plus juniper). 3 of them never used before in any other gin.
We recommend serving on ice with Fever Tree Indian Tonic.
- MALFY ‘Con Limone Gin’** *Italy* 18
Malfy used a selection of coastal grown Italian lemons-some from Amalfi and some from Sicily to give the gin a fresh zesty aroma. Using Italian juniper and five other botanical including coriander, angelica and cassia bark to give the gin a delicious and refreshing bite.
We recommend serving with Fever Tree Mediterranean Tonic or Martini.
- NEVER NEVER ‘Juniper Freak Gin’** *South Australia* 21
2017 Limited batch release. The Juniper Freak is a celebration of Juniper. Its an oiled-up beast of a gin. Wonderfully intense, aromatic, flavoursome gin. Fragrant pine and earthy angelica with a touch of pepper berry spice. Incredibly long finish, with resinous juniper oils coating the palate and pepper berry developing late.
We recommend serving on the rocks with Fever Tree Indian tonic or martini.
- NOSFERATU ‘Blood Orange Gin’** *Australia* 18
A delicious viscous gin with a noticeable orange tang, spice, vanilla and just a hint of bitterness.
We recommend serving on the rocks or a great substitute for the standard Negroni.
- THE SPLENDID GIN ‘Summer Cup’** *Tasmania, Australia* 18
Delicate notes of mandarin, rosemary and bergamot are carefully preserved through vapour infusion and balanced with juniper and coriander botanicals
We recommend serving on ice with Fever Tree Mediterranean.
- WHITLEY NEILL ‘Handcrafted Dry Gin’** *Liverpool, England* 18
Slightly softer and much smoother than traditional Gins, with rich notes of juniper and citrus, potpurri and exotic spices. The finish is a long one, with a subtle fade of herbs, cocoa and candied lemon peels, while the nose is both citrus-sweet and peppery, with a distinctive floral aroma.
We recommend serving on ice with Fever Tree Light.
- WHITLEY NEILL ‘Rhubarb & Ginger Gin’** *Liverpool, England* 18
The essence of rhubarb adds a tart crisp edge to a smooth English gin based while the ginger extracts warms the palate for a full-bodied finish. Botanical of Juniper, Orange, Lemon, Orris Bark, Coriander Seed, Angelica Root, Rhubarb Extract, Ginger Extract and licorice.

- AMERICANO** 16
Campari, Vermouth, Soda
This true classic was first served in the 1860s at Gaspare Campari's bar in Milan Italy. It was named 'Milano-Torino' because of the origins of its two primary ingredients: Campari calls Milan home and sweet vermouth is also known as 'Vermouth di Torino' or Italian vermouth. The cocktail was later renamed because of its popularity among American tourists around the turn of the 20th century and prior to the Prohibition. It's also fascinating to note that the Americano spurred the creation of another famous Campari cocktail in the 20s, The 'Negroni', it's said, was invented because one Count Camillo Negroni ordered an 'Americano with gin' while at a café in Florence, Italy.
- APEROL SPRITZ** 18
Aperol, Cantine Lamberti Prosecco, San Pellegrino
Aperol Spritz became popular in the 1950s, inspired by the Venetian mix of white wine and soda. The drink incorporates the Italian aperitif Aperol, which originated in Padua, Italy, in 1919 as a light liqueur alternative. It is the most popular summer drink of Italy and is perfect for a nice spring or summer day in Mooloolaba.
- CANDY APPLE MARTINI** 19
Chambord, Apple Liqueur, Russian Standard Platinum Vodka, Apple Juice
- CARDINALE** 18
Bombay Sapphire, Dry Vermouth, Campari, Cloudy Apple Juice
The Cardinale was invented by a Cardinal who frequented the Excelsior Hotel on Via Veneto in Rome. He suggested the recipe to his bartender, and the idea was a success with the other clients too, so the bartender christened the cocktail with the name 'Cardinale'.
- CARIBBEAN COOLER** 18
Plantation Pineapple Infused Rum, Lime Juice, Apple Juice, Pineapple Juice, Lic 43
Plantation Pineapple has a rich and delicious bouquet, accented by smoky notes and aromas of tropical fruit, pineapple, citrus peel, and a touch of clove. The palate opens with a structured, pleasant sensation of ripe banana, pineapple, and spices layered in a smoky finish. Our version of the Pineapple Daiquiri is shaken on ice to extrude the true characteristics of the pineapple.

- The original "Manhattan cocktail" was a mix of "American Whiskey, Italian Vermouth and Angostura bitters". During Prohibition (1920–1933) Canadian whisky was primarily used because it was available.*

- NEGRONI** 18
Campari, Tanqueray No10 Gin, Martini Rosso,
- While the drink's origins are unknown, the most widely reported account is that it was first mixed in Florence, Italy, in 1919, at Caffè Casoni (formerly Caffè Giacosa), located on Via de' Tornabuoni and now called Caffè Roberto Cavalli. Count Camillo Negroni concocted it by asking the bartender, Fosco Scarselli, to strengthen his favorite cocktail, the Americano, by adding gin rather than the normal soda water.*
- The bartender also added an orange garnish rather than the typical lemon garnish of the Americano to signify that it was a different drink.*

- The drink was invented and named by Ian Fleming in the 1953 James Bond novel Casino Royale.*
- A Vesper differs from Bond's usual cocktail of choice, the martini, in that it uses both gin and vodka, Kina Lillet instead of the usual dry vermouth, and a lemon peel instead of an olive. Although there is a lot of discussion on the Vesper, it is only ordered by Bond once throughout Fleming's novels – although Bond drinks the Vesper in the film Casino Royale – and by later books Bond is ordering regular vodka martinis, though he also drinks regular gin martinis. Felix Leiter ordered a Vesper for Bond in the novel Diamonds Are Forever, albeit with Cresta Blanca in place of Kina Lillet, which Bond politely remarks is the "Best Vermouth I ever tasted." It may be that Fleming decided not to have Bond order a Vesper again due to the way in which Casino Royale ends.*

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Displays a beautiful golden straw colour hue, as well as abundant and fine bubbles. Powerful and attractive nose first delivers aromas of fruit (pear and mango) and then releases light flavors of honeysuckle and white jasmine, lingering on vanilla and brioche notes. On the palate, flavors of cooked fruit (quince jelly and apricot jam) happily mingle with fragrances of beeswax and acacia honey. The long lasting aromas, composed of both fruity (candied orange peel and tangerine) and spicy notes (cardamom) is outstanding.

world, is completely influenced by its terroir. Terroir is a sense of place, it means that when you drink a wine, you completely taste the region where the wine was made. Most simply, terroir is the concept that the land from which the grapes are grown imparts a unique quality that is specific to that single vineyard.

Over the centuries, Burgundy has become known for being the best land in the world for producing both Pinot Noir and Chardonnay.

Tasting

The wine reveals a deep ruby red hue and intense notes of oak, spice and red fruits on the nose. The palate offers the same aromas and the nose with a harmonious combination of fruity and oak notes. With its smooth tannins and long, lingering finish, this well-balanced wine is the epitome of elegance.

ITALIAN WINE CLASSIFICATIONS

Denominazione di Origine Controllata e Garantita (DOCG)

This classification denotes the highest quality recognition for Italian wines. It is comprised of a relatively limited number of first-class wines. DOCG wines must meet all of the label requirements that the DOC wine must maintain with added caveats indicating stringent vineyard yield, grape types grown within precise boundaries, specific alcohol levels, and minimum aging requirements.

Tuscany and Piedmont carry the most DOCG wines in Italy.

Denominazione di Origine Controllata (DOC)

Basically the equivalent of the French wine classification, Appellation d'Origine Contrôlée (AOC).

Wines that fall under the DOC category must be made in specified, government defined zones, in accordance with particular regulations that are intended to preserve the wine's character that is uniquely derived from Italy's individual regions. There are currently over 300 DOC wines in Italy, all adhering to specific vineyard trellising, irrigation and vinification requirements detailing which grapes may be grown and where along with aging requirements and alcohol limits.

Indicazione di Geografica Tipica (IGT)

These table wines are often ubiquitous wines that are grown in specific geographical growing regions.

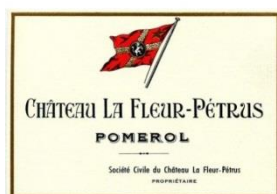
However, there are exceptions -- some of Italy's best wines (aka the "Super Tuscans") do fall under this category just to avoid more stringent regulations associated with DOC or DOCG and allow for more vineyard experimentation.

WINE REGIONS OF BORDEAUX



As a very broad generalisation, Cabernet Sauvignon (Bordeaux's second-most planted grape variety) dominates the blend in red wines produced in the Médoc and the rest of the left bank of the Gironde estuary. Typical top-quality Châteaux blends are 70% Cabernet Sauvignon, 15% Cabernet Franc and 15% Merlot. This is typically referred to as the "Bordeaux Blend". Merlot tends to predominate in Saint-Émilion, Pomerol and the other right bank appellations. These Right Bank blends from top-quality Châteaux are typically 70% Merlot, 15% Cabernet Franc and 15% Cabernet Sauvignon.

The **Bordeaux Wine Official Classification of 1855** resulted from the 1855 Exposition Universelle de Paris, when Emperor Napoleon III requested a classification system for France's best Bordeaux wines that were to be on display for visitors from around the world. Brokers from the wine industry ranked the wines according to a château's reputation and trading price, which at that time was directly related to quality.

The wines were ranked in importance from first to fifth growths (crus). All of the red wines that made it on the list came from the Médoc region except for one: Château Haut-Brion from Graves
